FUTURE ACTIVITIES OF IPCC 2016 - 2022

The side event focuses on the future activities of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) from 2016 to 2022 and the production of the Sixth Assessment Report.

The 21st Session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) held in Paris, France in December 2015 invited “the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) to provide a Special Report in 2018 on the impacts of global warming of 1.5 °C above pre-industrial levels and related global greenhouse gas emission pathways”.

The 43rd Session of the IPCC (IPCC-43) held in Nairobi, Kenya from 11 to 13 April 2016 accepted the invitation of the UNFCCC to provide the Special Report in 2018. IPCC-43 decided to prepare a Special Report on climate change and oceans and the cryosphere as early as possible during the Sixth Assessment Report cycle. IPCC-43 also decided to prepare a Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security, and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems.
