Professor Carlo Carraro holds a Ph.D. from Princeton University and is currently Professor of Environmental Economics at the Department of Economics of the University of Venice. He is Director of Research of the Fondazione ENI Enrico Mattei and Research Fellow of the Center for European Policy Studies (CEPS), Brussels, the Center for Economic Policy Research (CEPR), London, and the Center of Economic Studies (CESifo), Munich. He is member of the Bureau of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and Vice-Chair of IPCC Working Group III.

Professor Carraro is Director of the Climate Impacts and Policy Division of the EuroMediterranean Center on Climate Change (CMCC) and belongs to the Advisory Board of the Harvard Environmental Economics Program (HEEP), of the Centre for Applied Macroeconomic Analysis (CAMA), Australian National University, of the Research Network on Sustainable Development (R2D2), Paris, of the Istituto di Economia e Politica dell'Energia e dell'Ambiente (IEFE), Milan, and of the Coalition Theory Network (CTN). He has been recently elected resident member of the Academy of Science, Letters and Arts (IVSLA) in Venice.

Professor Carraro has been the Vice-Provost of the University of Venice for Research Policy and Management from 2000 to 2006 and collaborates with the Economic and Social Research Institute, Cabinet Office, Government of Japan, the World Bank, the OECD and the European Investment Bank. He is also member of the Board of Directors of the Harvard – Ca' Foscari Summer School.

Professor Carraro is co-editor of the Review of Environmental Economics and Policy and belongs to the editorial board of numerous academic journals. He has been publishing 30 books and about 200 articles on several economic issues. Current research interests cover the issue of coalition and network formation, including regional blocs, the analysis of international economic agreements, the link between trade and the environment, the development of advanced integrated climate economy models, the analysis of climate policy, the empirical modelling of technological change, the assessment of the costs and benefits of GHG stabilization policies.
