The Regional Adaptation Collaborative Program facilitates adaptation to our changing climate by targeting local impacts and advancing adaptation planning and decision making at the regional level.

The Program

- advances adaptation planning and decision making in Canadian communities to reduce risks and maximize opportunities of a changing climate
- facilitates collaborative action among federal, provincial/territorial and local governments; industry; academia; and Aboriginal and non-governmental organizations - more than 125 direct partners
- supports preparing for climate change impacts with best practices, guidelines, plans, regulations and policies for identified priority areas, such as floods, droughts, community health and infrastructure. By 2012, results will include new decision-making tools, knowledge and networks
- builds knowledge, such as that contained in the Natural Resources Canada's (NRCan's) assessment report, From Impacts to Adaptation: Canada in a Changing Climate 2007, and moves science into action through sharing of practical adaptation experiences



working with NRCan to address regional adaptation priorities.
