Progress Report: Final list of Co-ordinating Lead Authors and Lead Authors **Revised Workplan** First Authors/Experts Meeting in Eisenach, Germany 12-14 March 2002

- 1. The Terms of Reference (TOR), Table of Contents (TOC) and Workplan for the Report on Good Practice Guidance for Land-Use, Land-Use Change and Forestry (IPCC NGGIP-LULUCF Programme: Task 1) were accepted by the IPCC XVIII in Wembley 24-29 September 2001 (pending decisions were adopted in the Marrakesh Accords at COP7).
- 2. The Co-ordinating Lead Authors (CLAs) and Lead Authors (LAs) for the task were selected from about 300 nominations at 7th Session of Task Force Bureau (TFB7), where several selected experts also participated, in Geneva 13-14 December 2001. The TFB7 also agreed upon the need to establish a steering group consisting of the TFB Co-chairs and four LAs in order to ensure that the report
 - maintains internal consistency,
 - is consistent with the Revised 1996 IPCC Guidelines and with the existing the Good Practice Report,
 - can be used in practice, and
 - has complete and balanced coverage.
- 3. The IPCC Bureau XXIV (17-18 December 2001, Geneva) endorsed the list of authors and the establishment of the steering group as proposed by the TFB. It also decided that the list should be complemented with seven additional experts from specified regions (4 from Latin America and the Caribbean region, 2 from Africa and 1 from the Commonwealth of Independent States). These additions were coordinated by the Co-chair, in consultation with members of the IPCC Bureau from respective regions, and endorsed by the Steering Group. These additional authors were included in the list in February 2002 and finally endorsed by the TFB at its 8th Session (14-15 March 2002). The final list of CLAs and LAs is attached (Attachment 1). The list includes 101 authors, of which 41 are from developing or EIT countries. The TFB7 decision to

select the Review Editors for the task after the election of the new TFB in April 2002 was also endorsed by the IPCC Bureau XXIV.

- 4. An additional authors/experts meeting was added to the Work Plan of Task 1 (Attachment 2) at the TFB7. The reason for this addition was to ensure the preparation of a good first draft for the combined government/expert review for this complex and challenging task.
- 5. The budget implications of the additional meeting and the large number of selected authors would need increased travel support for experts of developing countries and EITs from the IPCC Trust Fund. The IPCC Bureau XXIV expressed their support for the budget in view of the importance of the work. A decision by the IPCC XIX is needed for the acceptance of the increase in the budget.
- 6. The First Authors/Experts meeting for Task 1 was held at Eisenach, Germany on 12-14 March, preceded by a CLA meeting on 11 March, also in Eisenach, Germany. The objectives of this meeting were:
 - To discuss the initial draft outline for each chapter of the report, paying special attention to consistency and harmonisation requirements;
 - To explore the availability of scientific and other material;
 - To conduct substantive work on all chapters with an accelerated handling of Chapter 2 (Basis for consistent representation of land areas) and with a view to producing the zero order draft of Chapter 2; and
 - To assign the authors to specific tasks and to identify expert gaps.

More than 100 participants (104 participants including the CLAs, LAs, TFB members, observers from the UNFCCC Secretariat and FAO and the IPCC-NGGIP/TSU) worked hard and constructively during the three-day meeting, and the meeting objectives were largely met. The good facilities, organisation and flexibility to changing circumstances provided by the German authorities that hosted the meeting were important factors for the success of the meeting.

7. The meeting discussed the initial draft outline for of the report, paying special attention to the consistency and harmonisation requirements between the chapters. All chapters are interlinked which complicates the work. A provisional draft of the chapter 2 (Consistent representation of land areas) was considered at the meeting with a deadline for its finalisation by 5 April. Detailed outlines for the other chapters were drafted and the authors were assigned to the specific writing tasks. The interlinkages and need for good collaboration between chapters was recognised and contact persons were designated to deal with specific links. The deadline for papers for the next meeting is 14 June. The next authors/experts meetings will take place 10-12 July 2002 in Tampere, Finland, and in September in Brazil. Both meetings will be preceded by a one-day CLA meeting. The first combined government/expert review will take place in December 2002 – January 2003.
