Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) to launch report on "carbon dioxide capture and storage"

Montreal press conference on Monday, 26 Sept. at 13h30 can be joined by teleconference and web cast

Geneva, 22 September 2005 – The WMO/UNEP Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) will meet in Montreal starting 26 September to, amongst other business, accept the "IPCC Special Report on Carbon Dioxide Capture and Storage".

The report describes new and emerging technologies for capturing the carbon dioxide produced by power plants and factories before it enters the atmosphere. The captured CO_2 can be stored in geological formations, the oceans or in minerals. Costs, barriers, risks and other issues are also examined in detail.

Produced by the IPCC's Working Group III on Mitigation, the report assesses the most up-to-date literature available in the world's scientific and technical journals. It was written by some 100 experts and widely reviewed by experts and governments.

2. Always contact the long distance operator of the country you are dialling from to ensure you are using the correct International access code to dial to North America.
